



Bandana Mini Frame

These fun frames are quick and easy. Created from the beautiful colors of Studio by Sculpey oven-bakes clay, they are light weight, yet durable. They are perfect for a papercraft embellishment or a fridge magnet.

Supplies

To create a frame that is 4 ½" high

Studio by Sculpey oven-bake clay in your color choice (Avocado, English Garden and Tropical Teal are pictured), 1 package

Pattern, attached

Studio by Sculpey Clay Knife or craft knife

Studio by Sculpey Acrylic Roller or clay dedicated pasta machine

Rubber stamp – choose one that is a line drawing, preferably leaves, flowers or swirls, they seem to work the best

Staz-On stamp pad, Black

White opaque marker - Opaque Writer Pen Carded-White #139080

Instructions

BASIC INSTRUCTIONS

- *Start with clean hands and work area. Good working surfaces include a glass or metal surface, disposable foil or wax paper.*
- *Upon project completion, clean hands, tools and work area with soap and water.*

1. Condition clay by kneading it in your hands for a couple of minutes until it is soft and workable.
2. Using the Acrylic Roller create a sheet of clay about 1/8" thick or use the thickest setting of the pasta machine.
3. Stamp your design on the sheet of clay trying to fill large open areas. Allow the ink to dry.
4. Cut the pattern out from card stock, you'll be able to reuse it. Using the pattern cut a frame form the sheet of clay.



5. Bake the frame at 275° F for 20 minutes.
6. Remove the frame from the oven and cool on a flat surface. If you created the frame on cardstock and baked it on the cardstock, remove it and cool on a flat hard surface.
7. Using the white opaque marker outline each line with white dots. Allow to dry. Tape your favorite photo on the back and enjoy!
